Workshop 1 - Feb 2012 Developing Effective Advisors

Driver

Looking for creative ways to support advisors to deliver effective (i.e. leading to change) personalised advice to householders about improving the performance of their homes.

Attendees

Community-based advisors, EDAs, educators, building researchers, social scientists, central govt

Outcome

The workshop participants identified a clear gap in the effective provision of household advice: ability to connect, share advice/experience, share training and secure funding to improve practice. Proposal to develop a Hub.

What did we think a Hub should do?

- Facilitate peer to peer conversation and learning
- Create alignment among key actors so there is awareness of one another, the work being carried out and what is working and what is not.
- Conect people to the existing knowledge base to prevent repetition and build the capacity of the sector more efficiently
- Create multi-directional links between advisors, researchers and policy makers to ensure their work remains highly relevant and practitioners have access to latest research and information
- Synthesise research and best practice into usable and useful tools.
- Provide opportunities for training

How did we proceed?

- Thought the concept couldn't be tightly defined at that point.
- Proposed a staged development

"The proposal for stage one is to establish a web-based Hub where participants can share existing resources and provide a forum for communication across the network. It is anticipated that in the longer term, the hub may evolve to having a life of its own perhaps developing resources, facilitating or even providing training. But until participants are clear on how they can best engage with this idea, it would be inefficient to start with a complex over-engineered 'solution'".

A pilot project

The pilot phase will test the Hub concept, establish arrangements for on-going collaboration and evaluate the outcomes. It will include:

- A member-only site login
- Public and private discussion forums and groups
- Regular blogs
- A best practice library
- Forums to provide feedback and input into the Hub's operation and design

Objectives of the Pilot

The specific objectives of the pilot are to:

- Establish a best practice library for practitioners
- Trial and establish the most effective mechanisms to facilitate peerto-peer learning and knowledge transfer (e.g. blogs, tip sheets, roundtable discussions etc.)

Establish collaborative arrangements to ensure the Hub is viable long term. This includes:


- Establishing on-going membership criteria and user guidelines
- Establishing information sharing agreements
- Establishing a quality assurance process to ensure Hub content is high quality
- Establish governance arrangements and the ongoing business / funding model.

 - Looks pretty good


